Topic: Topic Sentences

Rationale: The basics of topic sentences

<u>Time:</u> 60 minutes + writing paragraphs (HW?)

Procedure

1. Divide class into groups of threes or fours – 'What is a topic sentence?'

Forget Sauce Paragraph - worksheet 1

- 2. Give out worksheet 1 ask students to read paragraph & check unknown vocab.
- 3. Teacher highlights key terms 'fast food chains / profits / forget sauce' in the topic sentence students could use different colours.
- 4. Ask students to highlight the links to these words in each line of the paragraph. You could do the first line together. *Made from largely edible oil products, this condiment is never listed on the menu.*
- 5. Feedback using the answer sheet 1

Missing Topic sentence - worksheet 2

6. Give out worksheet 2 – ask students to read the first paragraph and identify the key topics:

Margaret Thatcher's policies were dominated by the philosophy of individual freedom and self-reliance.

And then highlight the links in the paragraph.

During the years of the Thatcher governments Britons experienced cuts in welfare payments and drastic legal restrictions on trade unions. Public industries were sold off to private investors in the belief that the free market would deliver prosperity to all.

7. Feedback and then ask students to write the topic sentences for the four paragraphs. Teacher monitors and feedbacks accordingly.

- 8. Give out sheet students choose a topic sentence and write a paragraph to show development, links to the topic sentence and a concluding sentence.
- 9. HW or class students write more paragraphs.
