Academic verbs to nouns

Lesson plan

<u>Topic:</u> Academic Vocabulary revision & consolidation

Vocabulary: AWL Sublists 1 - 4

<u>Grammar:</u> academic word forms – Verbs to nouns

<u>Rationale</u>: This is a game for students to practise their understanding and knowledge of academic nouns forms.

Procedure

- 1. Divide class into groups of fours
- 2. Give out one copy of the word grid to each group and 1 student the answers
- 3. Give an example on the board: *analyse(verb) = analysis (noun)*
- 4. Students take it in turns to guess one preposition and the answer is checked by the student with the answers who only says 'yes or no' (if 'no' they don't tell the answer so another student can try)
- 5. If a correct answer is said, the student colours that square, and tries to get 4-ina-row.
- 6. HARDER: Students have to verbally make a sentence with the noun.

Important:

No order - they can choose any word anywhere in the grid. Try to discourage the person noun – *for example: analyst*

Examples of four-in-a-row: The idea is that they try to get 4-in-a-row to win a point.
