

Introductions

Time: 60 minutes

Level: ***[B1/B2/C1]**

Lesson Plan

Aim: to develop the students' ability to write an academic introduction. It starts with 'noticing skills' by looking at a basic introduction structure and highlighting key points in sample / model introductions. It then leads into writing practice.

1. Lead in

- Ask Students to discuss what should be included in an introduction.
- Explain that usually it should have four parts / sections
- Try to elicit the four sections

*Students may not understand 'thesis statement' and this can be explained by suggesting it is their opinion and the key sections / topics to be discussed.

Introduction #1: [give out handout introduction overview] - ask students to read the introduction model and see how the four sections are structured. Highlight how the thesis links to the question, provides the key sections of the essay and provides a stance.

Introduction #2: [give out handout of 3 introductions] - tell students to read the first introduction and highlight the four sections (use different highlighter colours). Feedback as a class and then ask the students to look at the thesis statement and identify the 3 parts (question words, topics, stance). Feedback as a class to check. Then continue with the next two as a class or individually (depends on level).

Introduction #3: [Writing an introduction] students choose a title and write an academic introduction applying the skills they have just acquired.

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Introduction #1

Introductions usually follow this basic structure. It is really important to tell the reader your stance (thesis statement) and structure of the essay.

Introduction

1	General sentence – introduce the general topic / background and reason for the argument / controversy.
2	Specific – what is the main topic / information based on this topic / definition (if applicable)
3	Thesis – should include the question and the key topics of your argument. It must include your stance / opinion (answer the question (yes or no / to what extent you agree))
4	Outline – what is the general structure & suggestion



Inter-changeable or combined

Fair Trade negatively impacts producers and workers in developing countries. To what extent do you agree?

- **International trade has been predominately controlled by developed countries for centuries and developed countries have struggled to access this market. Fair Trade is a worldwide initiative aimed at improving the livelihood of producers and empowering workers in developing countries by generating better terms and sufficient wages (Fair Trade International, 2017). Overall, Fair Trade develops increased economic stability, higher salaries compared to conventional producers and educates community diversification, to a large extent the claim that Fair Trade negatively impacts producers and workers in developing countries is invalid.** This essay will focus on the main arguments connected to stability, salaries and diversification and conclude with suggestions on how Fair Trade could be improved.

First sentence
A general statement that does not include the main focus but introduces the issue / controversy for the argument

Definition
A paraphrased definition (don't copy/reference source)

Thesis –include question words and show your sections / key arguments of the essay (stability, salaries, diversification)

Outline – MUST explain what the essay structure will do and the outcome / conclusion

Introduction #2 - Worksheet

1	General sentence – introduce the general topic / background / reason for argument
2	Specific – what is the main topic / definition
3	Thesis – must include the question and the key topics of your argument. You must answer the question (yes or no)
4	Outline – what is the general structure & suggestion

Highlight the four key areas in these introductions: look at the thesis and highlight the key question words, topic areas and stance.
