Lesson Plan

1.Lead in

- Ask Students to discuss the 'title' and predict the content of lecture
- Ask students to write down key terms / language from discussion
- Feed in / check key vocabulary

Three types of lesson

Lesson#1: [hard]

- 1. Students listen once take notes.
- 2. Give 5 minutes to tidy notes.
- 3. Listen again and add to notes (use a different colour pen).
- 4. Give out questions set 20-25 minutes to answer.
- 5. Feedback answers (give out answers or go through on board).

Lesson #2: [medium]

- 1. Students listen once take notes.
- 2. Give out questions: Set <u>15 minutes</u> for students to answer questions from notes.
- 3. Listen again students answer the missed questions as they listen.
- 4. Give extra 10 minutes to consolidate answers.
- 5. Feedback answers (give out answers or go through on board).

Lesson #3: [easy]

- 1. Give out questions students have 10 minutes to look at questions.
- 2. Students listen and answer questions.
- 3. Give 5 minutes to tidy answers.
- 4. Students listen again check answers and answer missed questions.
- 5. <u>5-10 minutes</u> to tidy answers.
- 6. Feedback answers (give out answers or go through on board).


